ABSTRACT

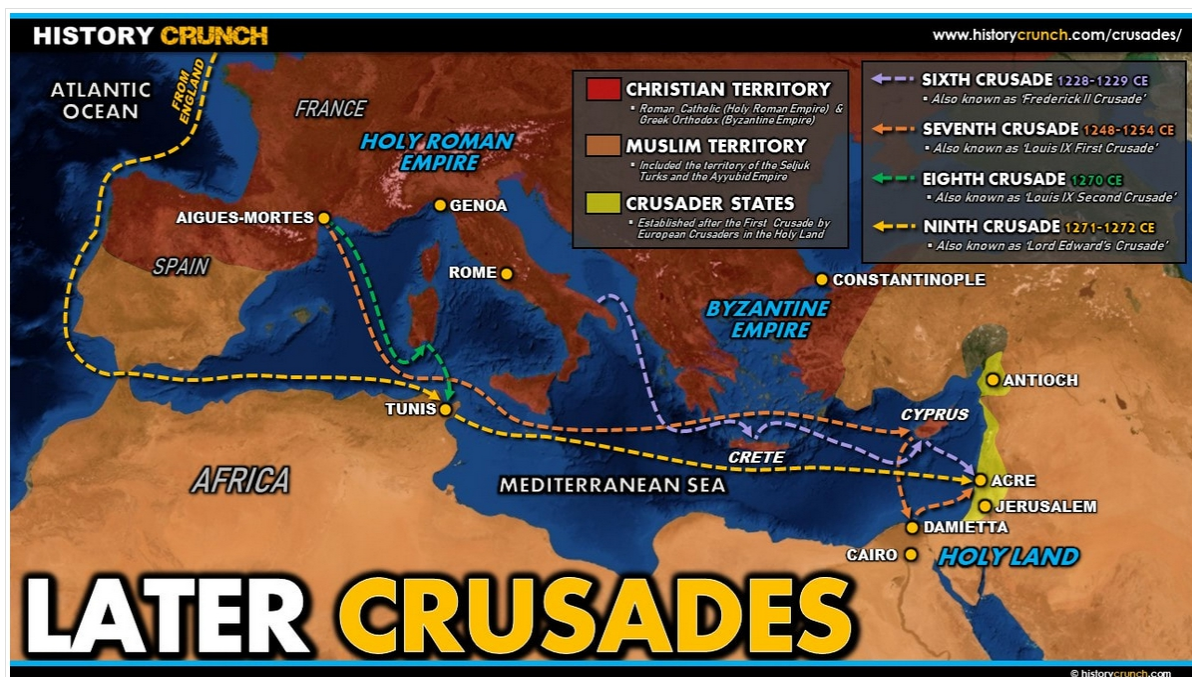
This report summarises the Crusades Events and concludes that a Modern Crusade between the Muslim and Western countries is currently continuing.

1) Introduction:

Crusades - Wikipedia states:[¹]

This article is about the religious wars waged by Western Christians to seize the Holy Land from Muslim control between the 11th and 13th centuries.

‘The Crusades (disambiguation)’ were a series of religious wars initially sanctioned by the Latin Church in the medieval period.[²]



A peace settlement was never declared covering the Crusades. The ninth Crusade was the last recorded after the defeat of the Christians at Acre by the Muslims, other Crusades were subsequently organised, but sufficient resources were never forthcoming.

It is reasonable to assume that this war is still occurring in a modern form today, but many Western countries are exhibiting a lack of enthusiasm to resist the influx of Islamism. The Middle East conflict with Israel is evident in several Western countries who now suffer from years of accepting Islam/Sharia Law supporting refugees to the point where that group represent a voting block in their own right.

2) Previous Examples of Unrest:

In 9-10 November 1938, was the action of ‘crystal night’ referred to in German as *Kristallnacht* recorded in Wikipedia:[³]

Was a pogrom against Jews carried out by the Nazi Party's Sturmabteilung (SA) and Schutzstaffel (SS) paramilitary forces along with some participation from the Hitler Youth and German civilians throughout Nazi Germany on 9–10 November 1938. The German authorities looked on without intervening.

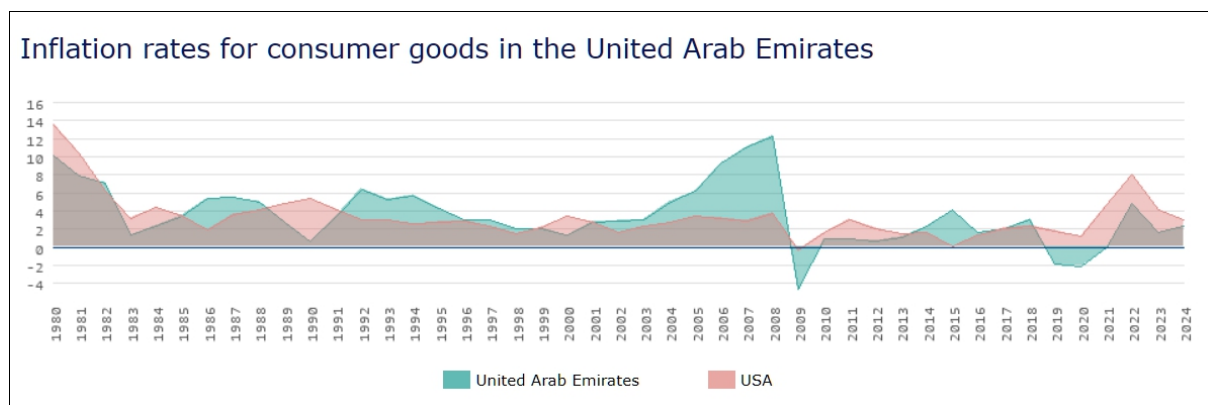
The most recent evidence for this is the occurrence of an ‘unprovoked’ attack on Israel by the Muslim controlled Gaza Strip occupants, on 7th October 2024. A part of this attack involved capturing many hostages, which at the time of writing, have not been returned.

3) Underlying Factors:

Both events occurred after periods of high inflation.[⁴]

In 1923, Germany was gripped by one of the worst hyperinflation crises in human history. The besieged Weimar government, short on revenue and under pressure to revive an ailing economy, tried spending its way out of trouble by printing high volumes of banknotes. The outcomes were disastrous, leading to currency devaluation and ludicrous scenes as ordinary Germans struggled to cope. The 1923 hyperinflation was resolved by the year’s end but not before causing significant suffering and a collapse in confidence in the government.

Both were closely associated with periods of high inflation prior to the unrest.

4) Arab vs Jewish Loan Regimes:

If we ‘follow the money’ in both of these examples we find a fundamental difference on how loans are negotiated.

The Arab system of lending money does not include interest rate charging whereas the Jewish system does.

Both systems function well until interest rates start to escalate strongly. At such times, the Jewish system starts to inflate dramatically whereas the Arab loan does not.

The difference between the two system of loans can be summarised as; the Arab loan is a share of the business, where as the Jewish system is purely a business activity. If the business turns bad, the Arab can write off the investment as an unfortunate act of fate, where as the Jewish lender is more likely to demand higher returns, backed up with threats of violence.

Both systems are backed by religious fervour. In the case of the Arabs it is “Islamism”. In the case of Jews (and by extension) Christians, it is the "Judeo-Christian" faith.

5) A Replacement Faith:

A more important consideration to both faiths is the land they stand on.

A current example of how this affects human activity is the current dispute between Ukraine and Russia. Russia sees Ukraine as an opportunity to turn back time to a previous era, whereas the Ukrainians have fought over an extended period, for the land they stand on.

Australian has embraced a system of Multiculturalism over many years.[⁶] This has led to several entities forming separate cultures in Australia, accompanied by the inevitable dilution of the original Australian Culture. In particular, the more aggressive cultures can take over our major cities. Currently, Islamism is a major problem in our east coast cities with weekly marches showing no respect for our Judeo-Christian faith. This is effectively is taking over The Land We Stand On.

6) A Solution To Multiculturalism:

The legal definition of Multiculturalism needs changing, through an Initiating Petition followed by a referendum of the people, to Monoculturalism.[⁷] This effectively establishes a new system of government in Australia which relies on Citizens Initiated Referendums (CIR) to form government. It is similar to the Swiss system of government, which has operated continuously since 1291.

It is noted that the Australian Government has promoted various examples of referendum, the latest of which was “The Voice” and largely defeated. This turned out to be a political exercise, which has since been ignored by several governments who have signed treaties with their aboriginal representatives, regardless of the wishes of the people.

To achieve stable government we must distinguish clearly between Multiracialism and Multiculturalism. Multiracialism recognises that many people of different racial backgrounds have come to Australia, but only those who support Monoculturalism in writing, and the traditional Australian way of life can vote, or keep an Australian Passport.
